An excellent fall day greeted buyers at Joplin Regional Stockyards for the Seedstock Plus Fall Bull & Female Sale. Topping the sale offering was Lot 141, J Lazy J Fortune 704S, a homozygous black purebred Gelbvieh bull sired by JBOB Carolina Fortune 2564J ET. Chad Struthers of Colo, Iowa, and Blackhawk Cattle Company of Oregon, Ill., teamed up to buy the bull for \$5,000.

The second high selling Gelbvieh bull was Lot 148, HUTR Justamere Khane 659S, a homozygous black son of Carolina Fortune. Justamere Ranch of Urbana consigned the bull and Bonnie Sells of Thrall, Texas, bought him for \$4,700.

Brandywine Farms of Rushford, Minn., consigned the top selling Balancer bull, BWF Brandywine Samson 641S. This LS/Plus Cimarron P207 son sold to Don Williams of Harrison, Ark., for \$4,400.

Topping the Angus bulls was Miller Focus 211 266 consigned by Miller Gelbvieh & Angus of Florence, Texas. Brandywine Farms of Minnesota purchased this Mytty In Focus son for \$3,500.

Two fall pairs topped the female portion of the sale with both selling for \$1,900. Burbank Cattle Company of St. Catharine consigned BWF Brandywine Primavera 459P, a NORD Nagurski M142J daughter with a double black bull calf at side by SKYS Balancer 75AN 549R. Larry Judy of Elkins, Ark., was the buyer. The other pair came from White Brothers of Topeka, Kan. GDW Black Sissy Fortune 4077P, a JBOB Carolina 3956L ET daughter, sold with an FHG Flying H LM/87M ET heifer calf at side. JS Farms of Harmon, Okla., was the lucky buyer.

Topping the fall open heifers was Lot 177, GMP Walnut Ridge 78S, sired by XXB Drew 565K. Walnut Ridge Gelbvieh of Republic consigned this heifer and Dale Waller of Baileyville, Kan., bought her for \$1,650.

Pederson Gelbvieh of Buffalo, Minn., sold the top spring open heifer calf at \$1,150. This Brandywine Napoleon 370N daughter sold to Lisa Bryant of Huntsville, Ark.

Ronnie James of Checotah, Okla., was the volume buyer of the day.
