The Oklahoma Gelbvieh Association (OGA) held its 16th annual sale at the OBI Bull Test Center in Stillwater for the first time this year. Buyers were on hand from several states to bid on both females and bulls. The sale began with the futurity heifers, an exciting group of show prospects that are eligible for the OGA Futurity Class held in conjunction with the Tulsa State Fair.

When the bidding was all done and the gavel had fallen for the last time, the top selling honors went to Oldenburg Gelbvieh of Mulhall. Their Lot 5 futurity entry, OLDG Ms Maci 24S2, a black polled SLC Freedom daughter sold to Chase Tabor of 4T Ranch, Columbus, Kan., for \$3,350.

Tying for the second high selling spot were two more futurity heifers. One of those was the Lot 8 double black, double polled PMG Pegasus heifer JDPD Goddess 202S consigned by Dromgoole's Heaven of Richmond, Texas. This heifer sold to Dylan Enyart of C Bar L Gelbvieh, Vinita, for \$3,000.

Also selling for \$3,000 was the Lot 9 entry brought by Chandler Ladner of Ladner Cattle Company, Argonia, Kan. Chandler has won the OGA Futurity Class on more than one occasion and brought a quality female back to one of the sales that helped him get started building his herd. This red, double polled Marksman female was purchased by Chelsea Johnson of Eucha.

Top selling bull honors went to Lone Cedar Ranch, Edmond, with their Lot 45 consignment, GALG Blk Hammer, a Flying H Free son. This bull sold to David Herman of Durant for \$2,700. Herman also bought the second high selling bull, Lot 48, Dirk 1P, a Freedom son from Gallaway Gelbvieh of Mulhall and sold for \$2,400.

The volume buyer of the day was James Dye of Dye Farms near Tulsa, who purchased three trailer loads of cattle including most of the commercial females offered at the sale.
