The Eagle Pass Ranch annual bull sale saw buyers from coast to coast. The quality was top notch and featured many of the Eagle Pass Denver pen bulls.

Topping the sale at \$4,000 was Lot 70, an Angus bull sired by B/R New Frontier. This spring yearling featured excellent birth to weaning spread EPDs and a 41.5 cm scrotal and 3.4 ADG. Dan Askew from Clarksville, Tenn., was the buyer.

Four bulls chimed in at \$3,600 to tie for the next high seller honors. The first lot was Lot 77, a spring yearling Balancer sired by Baldrige Nebraska out of a TLR Cocoa 35C daughter. Bruce Haerter of Hosmer bought this homozygous black bull.

Kevin Cantrelle of Raymond, Calif., bid \$3,600 for Lot 147, a homozygous black yearling Balancer bull by EGL Tenderloin N407. Vaughn Thorstenson of Selby bought Lot 146, also a homozygous black EGL Tenderloin son.

Rounding out the top sellers was Lot 2, an EGL Fosters son out of EGL Gwenth M223. Matt Abraham of Hazel was the buyer at \$3,600.
