The first joint production sale for Dromgoole's Heaven and Johnson Cattle Company drew interest from several states. Worrell Enterprises hosted the sale at its facility north of Mason. The Internet provided lots of bidding competition for those in the seats and on the phone.

Topping the sale was Lot 1, SCCB Nikki N06, at \$15,000 for half interest in the life and half embryo interest. Rocky Top Gelbvieh, Seth and Randy Cooper, of Missouri were the winning bidders on this 2005 Ring of Gold Champion Female.

Slipping into the next high seller slot was RTRM Headline 101P at \$13,000. B&B Farm, Mitchell and Jamie Broome, of North Carolina earned the right to half possession, half interest in this homozygous black, homozygous polled herd sire.

JDPD Rolex 151M earned a \$10,000 bid from Circle K Farms, Kent Kelly, of Kentucky. This homozygous polled red herd sire was the 2005 Ring of Gold Champion Bull.

Verner Farms of Georgia bid \$5,400 for a flush opportunity on CTR Ruby Red. This SLC Freedom daughter out of a Tom Horn female is a stout made powerful female.

Two bred females tied for the next high selling slot. Jumping Cow Gelbvieh of Ramah, Colo., bid \$5,000 for TWA Bright Lights 050P, a homozygous black daughter of BTI Extra 2106K ET. Cedar Creek Farm of Texas bid \$5,000 to own CSY Miss Chanel, an SLC Freedom daughter out of a Di Double Chief female.

The top selling open heifer was Lot 6, JDPD Mustang Sally 51S5, selling for \$4,000 to Genetics West of Berthoud, Colo.
